

## To the congregation and school of St. Mark's,

The past four years of my life have forever changed me for the better because of you and the opportunity that God put in my life to be with you, serve you, and live in your community. Early on in my ordination process, I had no idea that I would get to serve at a large church and Episcopal school with the privileges of preaching to school students, teaching Christian education, working alongside a great and hospitable staff, the honor of introducing world-famous choirs that have come to visit our beautiful Cathedral, and visiting many of you in your homes and hearing from you about how meaningful it is for you to be a part of this Christian family at St. Mark's.
