Thoughts from the Dean and the Stewardship Team

Mirrors and windows are both found in most homes and both made of glass, but differ in one very important way. Mirrors tell us about ourselves, while windows tell us about others. Look into a mirror for even one minute, and you're almost guaranteed to see something you don't like. It may be a crooked hair part (easily fixable with a comb) or a need to lose weight (not so easy, even with a gym membership). Windows are different. Through a window, we see the world around us. If we look long enough, we may well see something or someone that needs help. It may be the lawn of a shut-in that needs mowing. It may be a new neighbor we could invite to church. Maybe it's only a can lying in the gutter, which we could drop in our recycling bin. The question is, do we actually do any of these things? If we all spent more time looking through windows instead of at mirrors, we could make the world a much better place.
