# Dear Friends and Families of St. Mark's,

The past year and a half leaves me with a distinct aftertaste; as though we have been living a prolonged sort of "Advent" within our life as a Cathedral parish and School. It has been a long season of waiting upon waiting. We have taken the long journey a la T.S. Eliot's, "Journey of the Magi." And now we are dog-paddling

toward a "new normal" following the lock down; and at times our new normal still feels just out of reach. Our long season with COVID has been a kind of one-note orchestra of tiresome but necessary repetitions, all of us looking to the sky or horizon hoping beyond hope that there might be some break in the clouds and the drizzle.

For me, the Season of Advent 2021 is not so much the customary pumping of the brakes within the life of the Church and the culture that we have taken for granted in years past; given the COVID valley we have all trod, I am loathe to censure any store or establishment for playing Christmas tunes too early, or hanging

lights prematurely. I am standing with



everyone else prepared to raise a voice and sing "Here Comes Santa Claus, Here Comes Santa Claus," as I am prepared to sing, "Lo! He Comes With Clouds Descending."

I am grateful that our congregation is gathering once again. There is a palpable exhalation in many of the Cathedral and School gatherings, as we catch ourselves remembering the simple goodness of what it feels like to spend time together.

Of course the vibrant parish life that we carried into the pandemic is now a memory; we have had significant transitions in our staff as well as our programs.

Some good friends have said that it may be a number of months, perhaps a year, before we see anything like those times again. "Yes, yes, perhaps," I tell them; recognizing that they too feel that a new normal is upon us as a result of the pandemic. However, I am not quite prepared to wait that long. Christians have weathered any number of changes and transformations though the centuries, and they have (Continued on page 2)

been architects and builders of the "new normal." Once we know that our parish is on sound financial footing, I would like to "raise all the sails" on this Cathedral ship and head for open water.

I believe deeply in the words from Caryll Houselander that I included at the top of this message. The living God, the Risen Christ, waits and depends upon us to become the "chosen vessels of thy grace, and the lights of the world in their generations." {BCP 348} Without persons like us, those who honor the Sabbath on Sunday, and serve Christ in homes, offices, factories, and schools, there is no Body of Christ in the world. We are the Body of Christ in our own time.

We have been born to be those "lights of the world" within our own generation, and I see no good reason to put off being embraced by the deepest vocation of our lives because our attention, our habits, and even perhaps our hopes, have been temporarily interrupted.

Coming out of this COVID season we are inviting as broad a participation in our Stewardship and Pledge fellowship as we might imagine. Without the pledged participation of all of our friends and families we will be unable to raise all the sails of this Cathedral ship. Every financial contribution makes a difference to the ministry of our Cathedral, as well as for the "bricks and mortar" of our Cathedral. Every gift of time, every acknowledgment of the Sabbath, every prayer and action given to God in this place, is our participation in God's presence of truth and love in the midst of our own generation.

In the coming year I would like to bolster our Children's and Youth ministry, our music ministry, and finish our fund raising for closing the debt on our Little School project. There are also possibilities of expanding our partnership and community ministry that we share with groups like Community Renewal International and the Volunteers of America, the Highland Center, Young Life, and many others. Opportunity knocks at the door on the other side of this crisis.

This Advent let us remember those whom we have lost to the pandemic. This Advent let us remember how God has blessed us in the midst of our personal losses, and be grateful for those who have cared for the weak and the sick through the good days and the bad days. In the midst of this Advent, let us be humbled and grateful for the holy, good, and beautiful things that we share when we are gathered in our Cathedral, as we turn our hearts and minds heavenward. And perhaps most importantly this Advent, let us raise all the sails so that we might make the journey that God and the Gospel are inviting within the midst of our own generation.

# **Cathedral School News**

The return to school from Thanksgiving Vacation and the beginning of Advent marks a special point in the life of our 1st graders at St. Mark's. After spending the first third of the year attending Chapel with kindergarten, they have now begun to worship with the rest of the "Big School" by attending Lower School and Family Chapels. On Mondays, our 1st graders sit with their


5th grade Chapel Buddies, who help them manage their prayer books and hymnals. The Chapel Buddy relationship is very special, and most 5th graders will remember who their Buddy was when they were 1st Graders and take very seriously being a good helper to their 1st grader.

Chapel is of course one of the defining features of Episcopal schools and very important at St. Mark's, but service to the wider community is also very important. Prior to Thanksgiving, our students participated in the Porter's Cleaners Coats for Kids programs by bringing in a tremendous number of children's coats for Porter's to clean and give to



children who otherwise won't have a winter coat. We also supported the Loyola College Prep Flyers Aiding the Homeless (FAiTH) program by bringing in new toys for children whose families receive food at the annual FAiTH food distribution. We are very proud that once again a St. Mark's graduate is one of the Co-Chairs of the FAiTh program. This month each grade will adopt an Advent Service Project to support families or children in need.

Advent service projects and Chapel Buddies are two of the many annual traditions that help define and shape our school culture. Others include the Preschool Christmas Sing and Kindergarten Nativity Play, Christmas Lessons and Carols Chapel on the final day of the semester, and the Big School Christmas Carol Sing that always ends with the Twelve Days of Christmas. While Santa always visits the Little School, and 1st graders "ride" the Polar Express to the North Pole every year, we keep the birth of Jesus at the center of our seasonal celebrations and focus on God's gift of love for us in becoming incarnate. Service projects, special friendships, and our corporate worship are all responses to that gift of love!




