We All Need a Hand by The Rev. Rowena White

Stephen Ministers come from all walks of life, but they all share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need. Generally they are lay persons, but some are ordained. They receive training in Christian caregiving in their congregation and then provide one-to-one Christ-centered care to hurting people. More than one and a half million people in the U.S. and other countries have had a Stephen Minister to walk with them providing this high quality care to those in their congregation

care to those in their congregation and the community who are experiencing a difficult time such as grief, divorce, unemployment, hospitalization, loneliness, a spiritual crisis, financial stress, infertility, rehabilitation after an injury or stroke, terminal illness, long-term disability and countless other life difficulties. Stephen Ministers listen, care, encourage, and provide emotional and spiritual support on a one to one basis that is completely confidential, free and empathic. They do not try to fix a situation nor do they give advice; rather their attentive listening and acceptance provide comfort and healing. Stephen Ministers simply

seek to be fully present and prayerful that God will bring the healing as they listen, care, pray, support and encourage.

The Stephen Ministry motto is "Christ caring for people through people."

Several who have received compassionate care from our Stephen Ministers have shared their experience and gratitude. One writes: "I began to feel God's love again." Another says "Having a Stephen Minister during the last days of my parents' lives was a huge support." And another reports: "The consistency of my Stephen Ministry relationship was crucial in helping me cope during my husband's illness and death." Another spoke of feeling secure in sharing her fears and grief after her son died from a very painful type of cancer. Stephen Ministers have also shared about the unexpected blessings they received in providing this kind of care. One reports: "The experience has deepened my faith and opened my heart to any possibility where God is at the center." Another wrote: "Throughout my life as a wife, mother, grandmother, and in various other roles, I've been conscious of my Christian role in giving all I can to love and care for those in my life. But in serving as a Stephen Minister, God's presence has opened my heart and eyes to a deeper

understanding of love and care. In being present with those traveling through 'life in grief,' God has calmed my mind and soul, opened my heart to truly love and feel compassion and empathy, and given me thoughts and words that I know did not originate on my own. God has taught me to be open and present so His work can be done. Thank you Heavenly Father!"

St Mark's has trained nearly thirty persons in recent years to serve as our Stephen Ministers. Each has been carefully selected to serve in this role because of his or her caregiving gifts. Then they have received 50 hours of training by

our Stephen Leaders in providing high-quality, distinctively Christian care. Each of our Stephen Leaders has attended a week-long Leader's Training Course to learn how to effectively lead our Stephen Ministry. Our Stephen Leaders are Dean Alston Johnson, Fr. Thomas Nsubuga, Rosemary LaFargue, Pat Viser, Anne Lasseigne and The Rev. Rowena White.

Stephen Ministers are carefully matched with someone who needs the care they can provide. The identity of those receiving care and everything they discuss with their Stephen

Minister remain private. Generally Stephen Ministers meet faithfully each week with their Care Receiver for as long as there is a need. Those who receive care from our Stephen Ministers do not need to be affiliated with St. Mark's; this ministry is available to those from other churches and those without a church home.

In summary, Stephen Ministry empowers laypeople, deepens discipleship and increases the caregiving that is available to our congregation. The Stephen Ministry Logo symbolizes that we are all broken people, and that only Jesus can make us whole.

Sometimes we need a bridge and sometimes we are the bridge. No one I know has escaped troubled waters, rough seas and challenging, scary days. There are times in our lives when we could use a little help, and other times when we are given the chance to be that help for someone else. It really doesn't matter where you are right now. What matters is that you remember we are stronger together, and taking a hand is just as important as offering one.

Our Great Commission


