### So...Exactly What Is Catechesis?

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a children's Sunday School program. It is an internationally recognized program, researched and implemented by Maria Montessori and Sofia Cavalletti in 1954 to give young children (ages 3 – 12) the opportunity to understand God, Jesus and their relationship to God and Jesus in developmentally appropriate stages. The space or room that we share is called our Atrium. Before we enter the Atrium we remove our shoes, as it is our holy space, where everything we do is an encounter with our Lord.

The Atrium is set up Montessori-style with all our "works" on shelves and available for the children to work with, talk about and share. Each work relates to either stories of Jesus's life and teachings or the Episcopal church and liturgy. Each work has "real" (silver, brass, glass, ceramic, hand painted wooden figurines - no toys, no plastic) materials that relate to that work, which the child uses to engage and encounter the teaching. For example, if our work is the Kingdom of God parable on the mustard seed, we light a candle, read the Biblical story of the mustard seed to the child and then present the materials that accompany that scripture reading. In the case of the mustard seed, we place a real mustard seed on the child's finger. We also share a picture of a real mustard tree. Then we wonder with the child what Jesus meant when he said the Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed, and how does the tiny seed grow to the size of the tree? In the work on the parable of the leaven bread, after lighting a candle and reading the scripture, we let the children make dough with "three measures" of flour and water and then make another batch of dough with the same "three measures" of flour, water and also add the leaven or yeast. In about 10 minutes, we can see that the batch of dough with leaven grew and the batch without leaven did not grow at all. Again, we wonder with the children: how is Jesus's teaching about leaven like the Kingdom of God?

Some of our works relate to our Episcopal identity, including our Baptism work, during which we light the Paschal candle, fill a small baptismal font with water and talk about the gifts of the Spirit given to a child at Baptism. The Model Altar is a favorite work where the child sets a small altar with all

the items found on the altar in the Cathedral, such as the fair linen, cross, candles, chalice, paten, Bible, lavabo bowl and lectionary. We learn to pour the water and wine into cruets and thereafter from the cruets into the chalice, always discussing the purpose and meaning behind these special activities and their relationship to the Eucharist. We learn and practice gestures that we see in the church including the doxology, epiclesis, passing of the peace, sign of the cross and genuflection. We make many small flower arrangements each week to decorate the Atrium, like the flowers that decorate the altar in the Cathedral. We learn about the geography of Israel and the names of the cities where Jesus was born (Bethlehem), taught (Nazareth), died and rose again (Jerusalem). We discuss the seasons of the church year, the colors associated with each season and the different vestments of the priests. We use dioramas with hand painted figurines to share the

stories of Jesus's birth, the Annunciation, the story of the Wise Men, Shepherds, and Mary's Visit to Elizabeth and to share the story of the Last Supper. We have celebrations and sing songs. We pray.

Each work is designed to have more advanced levels of inquiry for the children of different ages. Our trained teachers or Catechists prompt the child's inquiry into the works based on their age and level of understanding. Each work has follow-up works to be done, such as making a collage of the Model Altar after they have actually set the Model Altar or identifying the cities on a map of Israel and coloring the map after doing the Geography work. After a Catechist has presented a work to a child, the child may go back to that work by themselves as often as they wish, move the figurines, make dough, pour the cruets, set the altar, arrange flowers.

Catechesis is spirituality in motion. Your children are naturals. They ask deep questions. They work hard. They pray from their hearts. They sing loud. It is one of my greatest joys to watch their development through the works and to be there as they finally understand that the love of Jesus is all around them in all they do.

The Reverend Ken Cooper had a way of making scripture meaningful and actionable with instructions for how to care for our neighbors as ourselves. His ministry to congregants and those outside the church walls was defined by his closing words at each church service – "Remember to clothe the poor, feed the hungry and love those who have no one but you to love them."

After his retirement from parish ministry, Ken dedicated his time, energy, and financial resources to the development of the St. Luke's Mobile Medical Ministry. His goal for this ministry was to provide basic medical diagnostic services to those in north Louisiana who had no access to healthcare.

Fourteen years after his death, a collection of his sermons encouraging ministry to the marginalized, Folks on the Fringes, has been published by his family. Sermons from throughout the church calendar year are included with the designated scriptures noted. The story of his passion for this ministry and the continuation and growth of the St. Luke's project following his death is provided.
