where the seating arrangements are not very clear and it seems like there may not be enough room to seat everyone. That can be a distressing situation. However, it is easy to fix with the help of the host, who politely

invites other guests to move their chairs a little to make sure everyone can be seated. It is nice to hear the host say, "Don't worry, we have more than enough room at the table."

This is how I describe us joining you for lunch a few Sundays ago. You may have noticed that a group of Hispanics joined you for the Rally Lunch in the Parish Hall. Thank you for making us feel welcome. It was a great lunch. A smile, fried chicken, and cookies never fail.

We hope you look forward to visiting us, in the same way we look forward to sharing our faith in the Lord with you.
