# **Our Bethlehem Corner**

A fish cannot drown in water, A bird does not fall in the air. In the fire of creation; God doesn't vanish: The fire brightens. Each creature God made Must live in its own true nature; How could I resist my nature, That lives for oneness with God?

— Mechthild of Magdeburg, Germany (1207 - 1297)

The most profound truth of our lives is also counterintuitive - God loves us first. Advent Sundays are tumultuous, with readings and hymns that speak clearly about the precarious, frightening, and sometimes disappointing journey that we share in this life. Advent Sundays speak to the truth of our shared "human condition," so that we can have some sense of the profound compassion that alston@stmarkscathedral.net God extends to us in coming to share

that condition. Advent Sundays remind us of why we yearn for beauty and holiness. The Nativity is when God initiates contact with us by entering life upon the terms in which we live it. God becomes a person so that we might know God as a person.

I find that Heaven sometimes moves in my direction when I am not even noticing. While the world is preoccupied with other things, while Herod is concerned with shoring up his political power, while the Scribes and the Pharisees are distracted by their own holiness project, a star appears overhead, and the eyes of foreign magi notice that the hand of God is moving.

The same is sometimes true in our lives. While our attention is focused in a variety of directions and we are concerned with other things – things that we ostensibly consider "higher things" - God is moving in the midst unseen, perhaps

unnoticed. Each of us may have a place called Bethlehem; some corner of our kingdom from which we do not expect great things. A corner kept from God, overlooked, or not deemed worthy of heaven's notice. Where might Bethlehem be for you this year? That place where we have not made room for God, but perhaps where God might decide and make room in our midst.

The cares of this life and this world have a way of creeping over us like kudzu climbing a tree and then blanketing a forest. Although it is green and alive and growing, it threatens to choke the life from us.

Our Bethlehem corner may simply be that place in our hearts and minds that we know is intended for wonder, love, and (Continued on page 2)



This is just a note to update you on some of the many wonderful happenings that are taking place on the campus of our beautiful Cathedral and school:

• The cleaning, sealing and repointing project is complete. It took the better part of a year to complete the full project, but it is finally done. A huge thank you to Clarence Babineaux for his tireless efforts in inspecting the work performed to be certain it was done to perfection.

• Your Vestry is also replacing some rotten windows and doors and repainting the windows on Cathedral Building. The current lift on campus is for the repainting project. Many thanks for your patience in working around the construction vehicles.

• Your Vestry and the Columbarium Committee have been drafting plans for additional columbarium niches on campus. Currently, we have only 8 remaining niches in the Barlow Garden, and the ministry of providing niches for our congregation and their families has increased significantly over the years. Please look forward to viewing the proposed plans on an easel in the narthex of the Cathedral after the first of the year.

• Large antique mirror from France, dating circa 1810 – 1820 has been donated to the Cathedral by Sandra and John Hoffman, in loving memory of Mary Colvin Thigpen, Pattie Colvin Thigpen and Mary Colvin Hoffman. The mirror has been hung in our Bride's Room in the Narthex of the Cathedral with a plaque recognizing this generous donation.

• A Florida flame maple tree has been planted as a donation to the Cathedral by Friends of Dru and Mark Florsheim in loving memory of their son Mark Florsheim. The tree has been planted beside the south parking lot on the edge of the soccer field.

• The Choir Lounge has been updated, repainted and refurnished through a generous donation and the creative insights of our choir members.

• Two trees have been planted and a bench has been donated to St. Mark's Cathedral School in loving memory of Jordan Rose McGimsey. The bench and trees are located on the school playground area for the children to enjoy.

• The two Youth Rooms in the Ministry Center will be updated, repainted and refurnished over Thanksgiving Break by the generous donation of the Parents Club of St. Mark's Cathedral School, and the space will be shared by both the church youth and the school.


