Grace in the trenches

Hello everyone!

I cannot believe it is already February. The saying "the days are long but the years are short" is definitely true. I am really feeling it as we prepare for Taylor to graduate from high school and move on to the next step.

I have been thinking a lot about children and how they see worship and time with the savior. I know it is obviously my job in many ways but this is different. A few weeks ago there was a baptism and there seemed to be a lot of babies carrying on conversations in the Cathedral that morning. One would jabber and then another one would respond. They seemed to be communicating or at least commenting on the sermon. The beauty in their jabbering to me was that there were tiny little minds being shaped into a tradition of worship and being with the Lord.

Two of my favorite moments in the service on Sundays are when the children come in from Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and when the children go up to take communion with their families. When the children come into the Cathedral they are so full of excitement. They want to be a part of what the grown-ups are doing. They want to tell their parents about what works they have been doing and the stories they are learning (even if it is not the appropriate time) their faces are smiling and they are so happy to come in and share with us.

When it is time to go up and receive communion, some of them race up the aisle. They are dragging their parents behind them. There is no fear or apprehension. There is no sense of duty. They are excited to take part in in this gift from God. They may take communion, or they may just receive a blessing, but they know that something special is happening at that altar rail.

I often watch them and pray for them, but I also think "What would people think if I rushed to the altar rail like that?" Don't worry, I'm not fixing to start running up the aisle. However, I can take that same joy in my heart as I participate in the service. I can work to make it not so much a duty, as it is a privilege to take part in the entire worship service. I can lift my voice to sing even when I am on the wrong page and I can read loudly when we read the prayers and responses together. I can also try not to quash the joy in my own children for all of those things. Full confession, I have been known to be a shushing, finger snapping, mean look giving, get your life together mom in the pew. This month I'm going to try to be more and encourage my girls to be more. But I'm still not going to let them roll around on the floor.

There is a book called Parenting in the Pew by Robbie Castleman that I would love to get a group together to read. I need a little accountability. If you would be interested in maybe a lunchtime group, let me know.
