Seeing Christ in the people of Honduras by Patrick Caraway

The first thing you notice when disembarking the plane in San Pedro Sula, Honduras is the heat. This is not a dry Arizona type heat. It is a Louisiana in July heat where

you start sweating by just waiting in the customs line. Two hours later (at 1:00 AM), we arrived at our accommodations for the week, a three-bedroom two bath house with no



air conditioning and no hot water (a commonality in Honduras). After inflating our air mattresses and settling in for the evening, I asked the Lord to give me the patience and fortitude

necessary to make it through this week as I awaited the occasional breeze from the oscillating floor fan.


We spent the next several days entrenched in Honduran culture, building relationships with the people, understanding and enjoying their food, and both showing and receiving God's love with the church members. A quote often attributed to St. Francis of Assisi is "Preach the gospel at all times and if necessary, use words." This statement could have been the theme of our mission trip as the only person traveling with us who spoke fluent Spanish was Chaplain Bulnes. Although the language gap was very evident in our normal communications, we quickly realized that sharing God's love requires no words. It can be shown with a smile, a hug, or the simple act of helping one another.

During our mission, we conducted "Sunday school" programs for multiple church services, brought meals to and visited with numerous church members, and even started the process of repainting the nursery. Through all our activities, we began to see Christ in the people of Honduras. There was Sister Nellie who graciously cooked all our meals; Jesus who drove our van and was nicknamed "Bestie Jesus" because of the friendship the kids developed with him; Donaldo who was a retired pilot with the Honduran Air Force and led a church service in the street: and Emanual, a seven year old boy who lived next door to Sister Nellie and had a smile that could light up a room. All these people showed us God's love and exemplified that although we come from different countries, different socioeconomic backgrounds, and speak different languages, we are all brothers and sisters in Christ.

As we approach Easter Sunday, I reflect on what the risen Christ said to his disciples on a mountain in Galilee: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." This statement is commonly referred to as the Great Commission and is charging Christians to go throughout our city, our nation, and our world spreading the gospel. Although the people we served in Honduras were already Christians, I know their faith and our faith was enhanced by a group of six

Thank you, Rowena, for your years of faithful ministry.







teenagers from St. Mark's Cathedral who were willing to spend their spring break traveling to the least developed country in Central America and sharing God's love with complete strangers who became friends.

At the conclusion of our trip, I thought back on that first evening sleeping in the heat and realized the Lord gave us all the strength to make it through the week. Not once did I hear anyone complaining or questioning why they came on such a trip. I instead saw joy, laughter, new friendships, and people from different countries who love each other although they had just met. This reflection reminded me of the story in Mathew's gospel where a Pharisee asks Jesus to provide the greatest commandment in an effort to test him. Jesus simply responds "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." Jesus was a master at simplifying the complex. We should do the same and remember that living out God's plan for us really is this simple.


