Finding Your Room in God's Mansion

Dear Friends and Families of St. Mark's,

alston@stmarkscathedral.net Recently I was visiting with a new member of our congregation who is joining us from another tradition within the Church. During our visit they shared with me feeling "at home" during our services, but they also feel challenged in the midst of the liturgy. He shared a sense of "presence and purpose" within the regular weekly round of scripture, creed, prayers, confession, and eucharist/communion. He offered a few comments:

"There is so much of the Bible actually being read – no cherrypicking, no proof-texting. The passages are long and not simply used to prop up some premeditated message..."

"The prayers point to the larger human family; we don't just pray for the concerns that exist within our little circle of life. In the prayers of the people it's as though we are *called out...*"

"The Nicene Creed is something new for me...although I don't completely understand it; I am glad that others have said it for centuries. It's like I am standing on someone's shoulders to get a better footing for myself..."

"Confessing my sins on my knees in a room with others...the lights are up – no mood music playing – it's powerful...very moving for me. *Things done and left undone...Mmmph*"

"The Lord's Supper every week? I sometimes find myself drifting. If I actually listen, or read along, with the words of that long prayer – it's almost too much information. I try to pay attention but get off-track; maybe it's the repetition – every week. Maybe it's the *bigness* of it all. It's like the whole story condensed into a *gut punch...and then God gives us pieces and*



parts of himself...the body and blood of Jesus..."

"A gut punch?" I replied. "I like it. The eucharistic prayer – a gut punch."

During our visit I was mostly listening, asking a few questions, but also smiling and chuckling along and finding myself delighted to share this new "view" and vision that my friend had stumbled upon. It was sort of like standing with someone the first time they see the Grand Canyon. Of course they have seen pictures and heard about the Grand Canyon; but to see it for the first time, and stand over it – that is something very different indeed.

I asked him, "Are you finding that the liturgy, the Eucharist, is a bit more protein than carbs?" He laughed and said, "Yes. Yes. That's it."

I gave him a little advice. It's advice that was given to me a long time ago by a priest who was helping me discover how to keep weekly worship alive and "real" in my life. When that tendency to go on auto-pilot, or "tune out," or simply get bored creeps over me.

This wise friend said, "Alston, you can't eat all of the elephant every Sunday. You may find yourself tuning out because you know that it is simply so much, perhaps too much, to take in; and so like most of us you retreat, or you imagine that it's rote and boring, and you might even begin thinking that your own thoughts are more significant than prayers, music, and actions that have been sustaining



human beings in God's sight for two millennia...such thoughts are simply the figment of your own dim, and rather limited, imagination. Rather than retreat into your own *lands*, hiding behind your own *borders*, find one part of the elephant that you can eat. God is trying to feed you; are you living a life in which you are actually becoming hungry for him?"

It's another way of saying find that piece of the whole that you can manage; rather than retreat, find that one doorway into the mansion of Sunday worship, and be content to remain in one room, rather than trying to be in all the rooms at once. Perhaps it will open upon another room. God is living within each of those rooms and waiting for us.

And so I said to our new friend, "If you find yourself adrift within the service on Sunday, rather than try to take it all in, to size it all up, or dismiss it all too quickly, simply find a corner and neighborhood between the readings and communion within which you can settle yourself; at the beginning of the service offer a small prayer to God...*Lord, I am ready to be with you for a bit, please show me where we will sit today.* I trust that the divine hand will point in a direction – the scriptures, the creed, the prayers, the confession, the eucharist."


I am looking forward to checking in with this new friend to find out where he and our Lord have been having their time together on Sundays.
