Following Christ in a Ministry of Reconciliation

"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! All of this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ." 2 Cor. 5:17-19a.

The Cathedral took the bold move to become a member of the Community

of the Cross of Nails. This makes us part of an international group of churches and agencies committed to the ministry of reconciliation in the world. We embrace the notion that we are to be a new creation recognizing that God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself. It also recognizes that in response to what Christ has done for us, we are given a ministry; that ministry is devoted to reconciliation.

As you remember November 14, 1940, was a memorable night for the people of Coventry, England. German bombers pelted the city with bombs. Coventry was (is) the Detroit of England. The lovely 14th century Cathedral of St. Michael was a casualty of this raid. There was nothing left but rubble and the walls. Provost Howard, looking upon this destruction at the hand of the enemy took a charred piece of the roof and wrote in charcoal, "Father Forgive." He did not write "them" for he recognized that there was enough blame to go around by all. After the war, teenagers from Coventry went to Dresden, equally bombed by the Allies, to help in their rebuilding. Youth from Dresden went to Coventry to do the same. This started the ministry of reconciliation that is the hallmark of Coventry Cathedral's ministry today. Provost Howard (Provost = Dean) also took three of the roof nails and formed a cross with them. This was the beginning of the Cross of Nails.

Fast forward to 1974, Provost Williams saw that an international community was needed to form interaction between churches and institutions devoted to the ministry of reconciliation and

social justice. This became the Community of the Cross of Nails. An international community of about 200 today. These communities are bound by three priorities: Healing the wounds of history; Living the difference and celebrating diversity; and building a culture of peace. This is done through prayer, especially the Litany of Reconciliation; study of the scriptures in small groups; and action, putting our faith into action to meet the needs of the local community. St. Mark's has been selected to be a Center for the Community of the Cross of Nails. Dean Witcombe came on March 10 and presented us with our cross of nails.

We are to be those whose minds are set upon this ministry. How do we follow Christ in a ministry of reconciliation? The answer for the Community of the Cross of Nails is threefold. First of all, we devote ourselves to prayer. The whole congregation has the opportunity to participate in this ministry. Prayer undergirds all we do. Each Sunday in the chapel at 10:20, the whole congregation is invited to gather for prayer seeking reconciliation. It doesn't take long, a couple of minutes. Come a bit early and undergird all we do with prayer. So important.

Secondly, we all can participate in the Ministry by adopting the mindset of reconciliation. Note that Dean Howard did not write, "Father forgive them;" he left it open ended recognizing that we all need forgiveness. We all need to set our minds upon forgiving one another and seeking forgiveness. We can renew our minds to this standard, in our interactions and our conversations.

Thirdly, we can seek to find ways to act upon this calling to seek reconciliation in the community in which we live. Right now, we are devoting ourselves to two opportunities. Once again all are invited to be involved. We are working with Purchased, Not for Sale, a ministry to women who are trying to exit human trafficking and prostitution. This is an important ministry for those who need reconciliation to the society in which they find themselves. It takes place every Wednesday from 10 to 4 (or any part of it). We also

A Campus Update...








It was Broadway at Church!

EFM: What You Put In Is What You Get Out

When I first heard of EfM (Education for Ministry), an inner voice encouraged me to look into it more deeply in my quest

to embrace my spiritual side. I was interested but was put off by the time commitment (weekly meetings during the school year with the understanding that those who signed up would stay on board throughout the four year curriculum). I am neither a Bible student EDUCATION

nor a Bible scholar and have dedicated very little time to reading the Bible. A limitation on my part that I have felt the need to correct for a long time.

I signed up this past year along with my wife Carol finally yielding to that inner voice and would now say that joining the EfM community is one of the best things I have ever done. It is spiritually fulfilling and rewarding and the readings are interesting. Most important for me is the interaction with the group and encountering a full range of divergent opinions on scripture, sexuality, the nature of love and hate,

digging deep beneath the surface to try to understand more fully our own relationship with Christ.

In EfM, you get out of it what you put into it. A lot of reading is necessary, but if family or other issues don't allow the time

to complete the reading one week or if you have to miss a meeting, then that's OK.

I've enjoyed all the readings and found one of the books, THE CROSS AND THE LYNCHING TREE, to help me better understand race relations from a black perspective and open

> my eyes to the history and meaning of songs such as "Strange Fruit" by Billy Holiday. In EXODUS, when Moses receives the Ten Commandments, "thou shalt not kill" is handed down but a few verses later is addressed as "thou shalt not commit murder." Why, when we study the Ten Commandments, is the former rather than the latter in common use? What contradictions do we find in the Bible by the various writers and translators who have been divinely inspired to complete the books in the Hebrew Bible and the New Testament?

Beginning this September, we will move from the Old to the New Testament and I am already looking forward to the group conversations we will have about that. I cannot overemphasize how fortunate I am to find myself in the weekly company of a group of men and women ranging from young age to old guys like me who are kind, open

to others' opinions, tolerant, and intelligent. For me, the conversations and the growing relationships are the key.

I would strongly encourage anyone interested in EfM to take the step as I did and sign up. You will find it interesting, rewarding, and knowledge and spirit building.


